POWERFUL LEARNING

Our mission statement 'empowering learners for their future' underpins our curriculum design. We offer a two-year programme that covers all learning areas and encapsulates our school values and learning dispositions. Glen Eden Intermediate students will be critical thinkers, problem solvers, effective communicators and collaborators.

What powerful learning looks like at Glen Eden Intermediate School:

- * learning is authentic, meaningful and relevant to our students
- * learning is co-constructed and collaborative
- * teaching is differentiated to focus on the learning needs of our students and individualised learning pathways are key
- * student choice and agency is fostered throughout our learning areas
- * students can articulate where they are at in their learning and what their next learning steps are
- * digital literacies are blended throughout the curriculum
- * learning is culturally responsive and inclusive.

Literacy

Literacy programmes teach students the skills, knowledge, and attitudes which will enable them to be effective writers, readers, and communicators. Literacy programmes focus on meeting the demands of the English curriculum and are integrated across all learning areas.

Mathematics

Mathematics learning is structured around three strands: Number and Algebra, Geometry and Measurement, and Statistics. Our students develop the ability to think creatively, critically, strategically, and logically. We do this by providing rich and balanced contexts and differentiating to meet student needs.

Inquiry

Inquiry learning encourages students to think like scientists and social scientists when making meaning of scientific and social phenomena. Inquiry develops students' understandings of significant future focused issues such as sustainability, citizenship, enterprise, and globalisation.









Health and Physical Education

Through learning in health education, students will be able to make informed decisions and to act in ways that contribute to their personal wellbeing, the wellbeing of other people, and that of society as a whole. Themes that are incorporated into the health programme include our school values, personal wellbeing, healthy communities and environments, relationships with others, and personal safety which includes digital citizenship.

GEIS has a skills-based programme for physical education. It is built around the principle that every child should have fun, participate, and learn new skills. Physical education includes the development of skills related to aquatics, large and small ball sports, and athletics.

Te Reo Māori

The curriculum recognises and acknowledges the importance of Te Tiriti o Waitangi and the bicultural foundations of Aotearoa. At GEIS all students have the opportunity to acquire the skills to communicate in te reo Māori and learn tikanga.

Languages

Languages link people locally and globally. We provide language programmes that extend students' linguistic and cultural understanding and their ability to connect with other language speakers. We are able to offer students the opportunity to learn a second language through our Ako options.

Science Learning Within and Beyond Inquiry

Our science learning philosophy is to foster and guide curiosity, to provide authentic learning contexts, and to give students meaningful opportunities to undertake investigations across all strands of the Science Curriculum. In addition to science being integrated into classroom inquiry, we have a well-resourced science room where students engage in a programme dedicated to providing hands-on learning experiences, specifically covering the Material World and Physical World strands of the Curriculum.



POWERFUL LEARNING

Specialist Programmes

Glen Eden Intermediate School offers a comprehensive specialist programme based around the arts and technology learning areas. Year 7 students are given the opportunity to participate in all eight specialist subjects to experience practical and creative learning. Year 8 students are encouraged to further develop their passion in four of these subjects.

The Arts

Our specialist arts programmes provide learning opportunities for all students through each of the arts disciplines: Sound Arts, Dramatic Arts, Visual Art and Video Production. Through movement, sound, and image, the arts transform students' creative ideas into expressive works that communicate meaning. Students will create musical and dramatic performances, artistic masterpieces, and short films.

Technology

At Glen Eden Intermediate School the aim of technology education is for students to develop a broad technological literacy that will equip them to participate in society as informed citizens and give them access to a vast number of technology-related careers. They will learn practical skills as they develop models, products, and systems. GEIS provides a wide range of technologies for students to experience: Design Technology, Food Technology, Hard Materials, and Enviro Technology.

Learning with Digital Technology

Teaching and learning is changing rapidly reflecting society and the key skills students will need in the future. Learning with digital technology enables personalised learning experiences and also connects teachers, students, and parents together in the learning process. Digital technology is integrated throughout the classroom programmes to enhance learning in all curriculum areas.

Learning with digital technology is a visible process. Google Classroom is used in every classroom to facilitate learning. Students can view tasks and submit work online. Parents can be connected to platforms for email updates or connected apps. Seesaw is used to showcase student learning.

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR INITIATIVES

At Glen Eden Intermediate School we promote a school culture where positive behaviour and learning thrive.

This is reinforced by several initiatives and strategies.

Teaching Values and Appropriate Behaviour

At the beginning of every year all students are explicitly taught the school values and appropriate behaviour expectations. These remain highly visible and are reinforced around the school throughout the year:

- -as an integral part of our school curriculum
- -through displays around the school
- -through role modelling by all staff
- -as a focus at assemblies and school events.

Consistency

At GEIS we believe in a consistent approach to dealing with student behaviour whilst recognising individual student needs. This includes a consistency in teacher understanding and the language being used, so students have a feeling that no matter which teacher speaks with them, their language, the approach, and the issue will be treated exactly the same.

Focus on Positive Incentives


Glen Eden Intermediate School actively celebrates student effort and success in all areas. This enhances the culture of the classroom, the Mini School and the school as a whole. School-wide incentives include: Excellence Awards, Values Cards, and Principal and Mini School Awards. Our aim is for all students to move to doing things because they are worthwhile and not just for rewards.

Student Voice

Students are encouraged to take ownership of their environment. Student issues are discussed at student-led meetings. Students are given the opportunity to make suggestions to the Student Council. At GEIS students are encouraged to be proactive in planning and implementing new initiatives that will improve student learning and student life at GEIS.













SCHOOL ORGANISATION

The success of Glen Eden Intermediate School is hugely influenced by effective transition processes that provide systems, structures, and strategies to welcome and support our new students.

Mini School Organisation

GEIS is divided into four Mini Schools with an Assistant Principal responsible for each team. The nature of these Mini Schools promotes a 'school within a school' ideology. This fosters a culture of belonging and pride both within their Mini School as well as across the whole school. Our four Mini Schools are named after local West Coast beaches that acknowledge the uniqueness of our local community.

At GEIS our classrooms are either a single teacher learning environment or a collaborative learning environment. Teaching pedagogy and technology used to support learning is the same irrespective of the physical environment the teachers and students are in.

Collaborative Learning Environments

At GEIS we have a number of collaborative learning environments. These are either twin teaching spaces (the size of two classrooms) staffed with two teachers, or in our recent build of four classrooms staffed with four teachers. These learning spaces allow students to have flexibility with their learning and to be supported by teachers with expertise in collaborative teaching strategies.

Enrichment Classes

We have two enrichment classes. These classes are for students who are high academic achievers across all facets of the curriculum. Students selected will demonstrate the ability to think creatively and function equally well in an independent or collaborative environment.

Learning Hub

The Learning Hub supports students across the school with their learning. We have numeracy and literacy teachers and a group of experienced teacher aides who work in the Learning Hub. Students are given extra support with reading, writing, and mathematics. There are also extension opportunities offered to students in writing and mathematics.

Specialist Subjects

All of our students take part in our Specialist Subject Programme with specialist teachers. This consists of Hard Materials Technology, Design Technology, Food Technology, Enviro Technology, Visual Arts, Dramatic Arts, Sound Arts (Music), and Video Production.

AN ENGAGING ENVIRONMENT.

Ako...to Learn

Students are encouraged to involve themselves in a wide range of activities through our Ako programme. All students will participate in school-wide and/or class Ako options which occur once a week during terms two and three. Options can include activities such as vegetable and herb gardening, languages, philosophy, health and fitness, literature, debating, music, visual art, and performance and cultural groups.

After School Enrichment Courses

GEIS offers a comprehensive After School Programme that caters for about 130 students each term. These courses are designed to be fun, challenging, and exciting, and are facilitated by experienced, skilled tutors.

Community Service

Our students are regularly involved in community projects. The School Council takes a lead role in organising fundraising events and have made contributions towards a number of local and international charities. Additionally, GEIS has regularly been awarded World Vision Scholarships (for students to attend the World Vision 40 Hour Famine Leaders Day) for being in the top 20 schools in New Zealand. GEIS has been involved in a number of community clean up and planting projects as our students learn about the importance of protecting and nurturing their environment.

Dance Groups

Each year students have the opportunity to join a dance group tutored by professional dance teachers. The dance groups perform at competitions, dance showcases and at our local schools.

Environmental Education

At Glen Eden Intermediate our aim is to promote sustainable thinking and practices.
Students at GEIS have opportunities to get involved in projects in and around our school.
Some examples of these are recycling, planting, and caring for native trees in our popular bird walk area, and worm farming. Students learn how to grow organic produce and then enjoy cooking the food they have grown. Students are also given opportunities through their classroom inquiries, the Enviro group and Ako to explore some of their own ideas around creating a more sustainable school and world.

Kapa Haka Group

Te Rōpu Kapa Haka ō Tiriwa, welcomes school visitors with a traditional pōwhiri and performs at special events and school assemblies. At GEIS all students are welcome to join our Kapa Haka Group. Students learn and understand the pōwhiri process, waiata, haka, poi, and the basic skills to be a confident Kapa Haka performer. Te Rōpu Kapa Haka ō Tiriwa meet once a week.

Literacy and Numeracy Enrichment Programmes

Keen writers have the opportunity to join an extension writing group that focuses on developing student authorship. Students involved enter New Zealand-based competitions over the year and many become published authors.

Extension groups are also available for students who demonstrate aptitude in mathematics. Students may represent GEIS in the Auckland Mathex Competition and/or participate in the Otago Problem Solving Competition.











Music Opportunities

GEIS offers a number of musical opportunities each year. We have a concert band for those with musical instrument experience to play in and extend their talents, as well as Year 7 and 8 Rock Bands. In alternate years we have a choir and a full-scale musical production. All groups perform for a variety of audiences. One-to-one music lessons are available with private tutors in many band/orchestra instruments during school hours with a weekly cost for tuition. Pacifika Group

The Pasifika Group is made up of students from a variety of different backgrounds and beliefs. The Pasifika Group learn a variety of traditional songs and dances from across our Pacific nations. It meets once a week, and we have external tutors that teach our group.

Production

Bi-annually GEIS delivers a production of the highest quality. Being part of a GEIS production is an experience to be remembered. Students can be involved in performing, creating props and stage sets, behind the scenes backstage crews, costume designing, sound and lighting crews, makeup teams, photo and video production. It is a true showcase of student creativity and talent. Keen actors/actresses, singers, and dancers are encouraged to audition.

Sport

GEIS has a full-time Director of Sport who organises all aspects of our comprehensive sports programme. Inter-class and Mini School sports competitions are held at lunchtimes, where participation and enjoyment are the key elements. Every student is involved in fitness and physical education programmes.

Students are given the opportunity to participate and compete at their own level in most sports from athletics to water polo. GEIS has midweek netball, water polo, and basketball teams that compete in leagues.

GEIS also participates in the several sports camps held in Matamata and the NZ AIMS Games (national championships for intermediate schools) held in Tauranga.

We regularly achieve success in the Waitakere and Auckland regional competitions in a number of sporting codes.

Student Leadership

At GEIS students are encouraged to take on leadership roles across the school. Each year a student leadership team is selected that consists of a Head Boy, Head Girl, Deputies, and Māori and Pasifika Student Leaders. This team facilitates our hardworking Student Council which has representatives from every class. Other student leadership roles include Mini School sports captains and Enviro leaders. We see these leadership positions as an opportunity for students to take part in democratic decision making and to further develop the skills that will empower them for the future.

SCHOOL FACILITIES

Students at GEIS have the opportunity to be supported in their learning and educational experiences through the use of the following facilities:

Artificial Turf

We have an all-weather artificial turf for hockey, netball, and tennis. This is used regularly for fitness and physical education programmes. The turf and gymnasium allow us to provide physical education all year round, unhindered by weather.

Auditorium

Our auditorium provides a magnificent venue to support the creative talents of our outstanding dance, drama, and music students. This facility is available for school and community events and is well equipped with state-of-the-art sound and lighting.

Gymnasium

GEIS has a full-size gymnasium. This fantastic facility is available for school and community use. It has three volleyball courts, a netball court, a basketball court and badminton courts. Students use this for daily fitness and physical education programmes.

Library

Our library is a well-resourced facility, providing students with a spacious, comfortable environment where they can relax, research, and read. We have a large, modern collection of fiction, non-fiction, sophisticated picture books, graphic novels, and high interest read books to support student inquiry and recreational reading. Library displays are updated regularly, showcasing our latest books. Classes are rostered for a library session fortnightly and students also have the opportunity to use the library in their own time.

The library is open daily, 8.30 am until 3 pm, with extended hours on Tuesday and Thursday until 4 pm. We have a full-time librarian managing and promoting the library.

Music/Drama

Our performing arts block includes a dance/drama studio, music room, and practice rooms for private tuition. The performing arts programmes focus on students creating performances in music, dance, and drama.

Science Room

To support the Science Curriculum and ensure students have opportunities to participate in authentic practical science, GEIS has a science lab which classes have access to on a weekly basis. Experiments are carefully planned and activities include students using microscopes and chemicals.





Swimming Pool

We have a 25-metre heated pool, which provides all students with an opportunity to participate in swimming programmes during terms one and four. These are for every class and cater for individual levels. School and zone swimming sports are a focus, along with lunchtime swimming and special swimming programmes.

Technology Building

This building houses a Design Technology Room, Food Technology, Hard Materials and Enviro Technology Rooms, Television Studio, Art Room, two classrooms and an atrium for displaying students' work.

Television Studio (Cactus TV)

We have a television studio which is well equipped to offer all students the opportunity to film and edit. Video Production is one of our specialist subjects. Students produce a daily television show, which includes news and video clips of current events. This is broadcast live to each classroom each morning through the class televisions.

Tuck Shop

Libelle Group runs our school café, and the menu is designed to meet Ministry of Education guidelines for healthy eating. It provides a variety of nutritious snacks, meals, and lunches, and opens at 8.30 am daily. The menu for the café is on the school website.

GENERAL INFORMATION

A list of the current Board of Trustee members is available on the school website. Meetings are advertised on our website.

Bring Your Own DeviceWe aim for all classes at GEIS to have a 1.1 device to student ratio and we are a Google-suite school. Students may bring their own Chromebook which they need fully charged and at school every day. Bringing their own device will mean that learning can continue in and out of class, at school, and at home. Devices should have a sturdy carry case and screen protector and are locked away at break times. Our network is monitored and filtered. GEIS has a cybersmart curriculum - designed to empower students to think critically, behave safely, and participate responsibly in our digital world.

We aim to provide students who are not able to bring their own device access to a Chromebook during school hours.

GEIS uses only Chromebooks as other tablets and laptops experience more frequent technical problems on our system which can inhibit learning. When selecting the type of device to purchase it might be worth considering the requirements for their future college.

Communicating with the School


Glen Eden Intermediate has an open communication philosophy and encourages parents to contact teachers if they have any concerns about their child. The Mini School leaders or the Senior Leadership Team, consisting of the Principal and three Deputy Principals, are available to meet with parents to discuss more serious matters.

In terms of communication, we find that email is the most reliable and convenient form of digital communication between parents and teachers rather than other messaging apps and websites. For school-wide communication we have our website and hail. Students need to check hail regularly to keep up to date with messages, notices, and upcoming events.

Please note that parents or visitors must report to the office first if they want to speak with a child or visit a classroom. This is to maintain school security and to protect our students.

Student absences can be reported through the school website, school app or alternatively you can telephone the school.





Enrolments

In Zone:

The law requires that GEIS gives priority to enrolling students who live in our home zone. Out of Zone:

Out of zone places, where available, are offered according to the following priorities:

Priority 1: Sibling of current student

Priority 2: Sibling of former student

Priority 3: Child of former student

Priority 4: Child of board employee

Priority 5: All other applicants

Where the number of students exceeds the places available, a ballot will be held from the group with the lowest priority according to the rules set down by the Secretary of Education.

Course Fees

Course fees cover take-home materials used in specialist programmes. An outline of current costs is available from the school office.

GEIS School Website, **App and Facebook Page**

The school website (www.geis.school.nz) is a great place to access up to date school information and events coming up through the school calendar. It also has up to date enrolment information. Our school app is a great way to get important reminders and notifications sent directly to your phone or tablet. Other features include links to our website and Facebook page, absence notifications and one-touch dialing. You can choose to get group notifications about school buses or school events. When downloading the Glen Eden Intermediate School official mobile app make sure you 'allow push notifications' so that you receive messages from the school. The app can be downloaded from the app store or playstore or using the links on our website. Our school Facebook page (Glen Eden Intermediate School) is another important communication tool for us, where you can view and access up to date information, including photos and videos of school events. Please 'like' our page to follow us on Facebook.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Health and Safety

A qualified first aider runs our Health Centre. Students who feel unwell at school must report to the Health Centre. It is essential the school be made aware of any health problems a student may have and that contact telephone numbers are correct. Please advise the office if there are any changes. All medicines must be clearly labelled and for certain medication the parent or caregiver must fill in a form giving permission for administration.

International Students

Glen Eden Intermediate School welcomes international fee-paying students. We have a long history of working with international students and have been a signatory to the NZQA Education Code of Practice for International Students since 2002. We want our international students to embrace all on offer at GEIS as they work towards excellence and becoming effective global citizens. Our "kiwi kids" have the opportunity to become a 'buddy' or homestay host for our international students, reinforcing the concept of globalisation in the 21st Century.

Our international students' experience at our school is further enriched by the wonderful, caring homestay families that support our programme. These friendly and welcoming families go out of their way to provide an outstanding home life for our guests. Additionally, our sister school relationships in Thailand, South Korea, Japan, and China, enable our students to experience first-hand, the Asian culture.

Money, Mobile Devices, and Valuables

If these items are brought to school, they MUST be handed to the class teacher to store in the classroom safe until 3 pm. Teachers will take all possible care, but they cannot accept responsibility for any loss.

Newsletters

These are published regularly and posted on our website, school app, and emailed to parents/caregivers. These newsletters are the bridge between home and school, so please look out for them.

Please note that the newsletter is the official communication between home and school, and parents are considered to have read and responded to any requests in them.

Parent/Community Involvement

We encourage parent and community support and involvement in our school. There are a number of different opportunities for parents and caregivers to be involved in the school from class excursions and school camps to supporting our many different groups going out and representing GEIS.

We also have hui evenings with our Māori and Pasifika families and information evenings for parents and the community where we share a range of different activities and programmes happening at the school.





INFORMA

Reporting to Parents

At GEIS we acknowledge the importance of the Home/School partnership. To enhance this relationship there are two conferences held during the year with parents/guardians/ caregivers, the teacher and the student. The student is an integral part of this process enabling them to take responsibility for their own learning.

Term 1: Meet the Teacher Afternoon/Evening. This is an opportunity for the parents to meet their child's teacher and share any relevant information that their teacher should know about their child and their learning.

Term 2: Mid-year progress report is issued. Term 3: Student-Led Conferences. This is an opportunity for students to share their learning with their whānau in collaboration with their teacher.

Term 4: End-of-year report is issued.

Stationery

Stationery lists for students will be available on the school website.

Students' Absences

We operate an electronic roll, which means that any absences not covered by a previous day's notification (school website or school app) or morning answerphone message, will receive a phone text asking for absence details and for you to confirm they are genuinely absent. You will need to reply to the text to let us know that your child is absent from school.

Please send an email or a dated note, written and signed by a parent, in all cases where students are required for medical or dental appointments, when exemption from sports or physical education is required, or when students are unable to wear specific items of school uniform. Please ensure all students are at school by 8.45 am each day. If students arrive after 8.45 am they must sign in at the front office. Students leaving the school grounds during the school day will also need to sign out at the office and wait at the office to be collected.

Transport

We actively encourage our school community to use sustainable modes of transportation e.g. walking, cycling, carpooling, and public transport. We acknowledge that this will increase student safety awareness, health, and fitness.

Bikes/Scooters: Students may ride their bikes/scooters to school. These are parked inside the bike shed and need to be locked in place. Bikes/scooters are not to be ridden in the school grounds between 8.00 am and 3.30 pm. All students must abide by the New Zealand Road Code. This includes wearing an approved safety helmet. Buses: Students may travel by bus from Huia, Laingholm, Woodlands Park, Green Bay, Oratia, Henderson Heights, and Sturges Rd. A letter is available from the school office containing information on bus times, costs, and routes. Public buses are also available, and parents should contact AT (Auckland Transport) regarding these. Bus routes are subject to change on a year-by-year basis.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

All students attending Glen Eden Intermediate School are required to wear the official school uniform when travelling to, attending, and travelling home from school.

All students are expected to be clean and neatly dressed. The only jewellery allowed is a watch and one pair of plain gold or silver stud earrings. No makeup or nail polish is allowed.

As part of our sunsmart programme, hats are compulsory during term one and term four whenever students are outside. Hats are not to be worn inside.

Footwear

Shoes: Must be plain black, leather lace-up school shoes (school shoe style not sports shoe) with black laces, T-bar or Mary Jane style. No colour labels or emblems allowed. They are to be worn with plain, above-the-ankle white socks. Black opaque tights may be worn in the winter months.

Sandals: Must be plain black leather, have a back strap, and buckle at the ankle (optional in summer, but shoes must be worn to technology classes).

Uniform Shop

School uniform can be purchased online (glenedenintermediate.nzuniforms.com) or from the school uniform shop located at the school. The uniform shop is open Monday-Friday between 8.00 am and 9.00 am during term time only. Please refer to the school website for additional opening hours in November and January.
